

- · Overall, Dr. Johnson is a highly intelligent professor and seems to explain things fairly clearly. However, I do not agree with his decision to weigh the four exams for 84% of the overall grading system, while only 8% for hw and iclicker questions. I feel that if the tests were only counted as 50% of the grade, my grade would be more satisyfing and deserving (a letter grade higher!!). If he weighs the tests so high, you would think that the tests themselves would be a piece of cake, but that is clearly not the case when you consider his class averages of 75%. 75%!! They are rather tricky for most and I can justify that easily when you observe koofers.com and it shows his average rating as a professor. And, not to misquote him here, but somwhere in his syllabus he is satisfied with a overall class average of 75 on each of his exams, and therefore will not curve them. Really? If I was him, I'd strive for a much higher class average like an 85 and thus would have better results as a teacher and for his pupils. He says that he would curve grades by a few minor points if the mean was below that average of 75, but still it does not add up well or fairly in my standing. I am sitting at possibly a B- for the course pending on the final and want a B but that is only possible if he were to make the averages for the tests 34 points fewer!! As the NFL Sunday Countdown crew says, "Come on man" perfectly fits this predicament and should be considered highly by the professor himself to change (i.e. lower significantly) the weight percentages for the exams if he expects higher grades from his students and a better overall approval rating as a professor.

 Mastering Geology was a waste of time. Though, the web resources were good for studying.


Neil is an interesting and respectful instructor.

  so my mind was always focused on my hunger.



- It was hard to stay interested in the material when it was presented in such a boring way





#### 14. I learned to identify problems and explore different solutions.








#### 16. The instructor seemed concerned about whether students learned the material.




#### 17. I became more aware of multiple perspectives on issues in this field.
