8. What did the instructor do that most helped in your learning?

- Put slides on scholar to reference. Was always willing to answer my questions.
- Professor Johnson provided the lectures online ahead of time, giving students an opportunity to read through material at any point, which was helpful both before coming to class and while preparing for exams. He also tried to make the material more interesting and relatable, which helped students to remember the material.


- I took this class in the GLC and the room itself wasn't that

- The lights were really bright and the seats were too comfortable


